Governor Booth Gardner issued a proclamation establishing October 1989 as Family History Month. It is hoped that family history will be emphasized by each Society during the month of October.

Scandinavian Research by EGS member Bob Sandbo - In search of my Scandinavian ancestors in Minnesota, I wrote to the pastor of the church that would be most likely to have the records of the rural church my mother's family attended near Watson, Chippewa County, Minnesota. After about two months I received the record of her parent's marriage in 1876, a record of her maternal grandfather's death in 1910, and her grandmother's burial in 1907. He also disclosed that the parish secretary is active in the Chippewa County Historical Society. No list of organizations that I had seen before had listed this Society which would be deserving of my support since it was the home of all my grandparents upon their emigration to America.

SUPPLY TABLE NEWS

We've just received a large order from the Family History Library of LDS. If you haven't seen these publications from Salt Lake City, please take a minute to study them. They are truly outstanding in their format and the information contained. We now have their series of reference outlines for research in the United States. There's a booklet for the country as a whole, for the District of Columbia, and for each state except New York, which isn't yet completed. The UNITED STATES RESEARCH OUTLINE is a 52-page guide to U.S. sources focusing in particular on federal references. The state and Washington DC booklets vary in length and review the following: 1) what records exist, 2) who has the original records, 3) whether a statewide or districtwide index exists, 4) whether the Family History Library has copies, and 5) how to find the records listed in the Family History Library catalog.

Also from the LDS Library, we again have those wonderful booklets on Scotland, Ireland, England, France, and other foreign countries. (Sad to say--"Germany" is out of print!) The "flow-chart" in some of these is so very helpful--worth the cost in itself, I believe.

Volume IV of EGS' HOME LIBRARY was delivered at our August meeting--hot off the press. As most of you know, these volumes list our members' private holdings which they're willing to share with others. A number of rare and out-of-print items are to be found in "home libraries" and to locate them you need all four volumes because there is no duplication. Thanks to Betty Pfeiffer for a great job!

Our various forms always seem to sell well even though we never have enough space to display even a sample of them. Please ask if you don't see what you need. We have ancestor charts, family group sheets, lineage charts, census search forms, correspondence and research logs--you name it, we probably have it!

The first daughter was named for the maternal grandmother: second daughter for the paternal grandmother: and the third daughter after the mother.

Opening of 1920 Census May Be Delayed - The Federation of Genealogical Societies has been advised by someone in Washington, DC that the opening of the 1920 Census may be delayed due to funding problems. The release of 11,000 rolls of microfilm of the 1920 Population Schedules which had been anticipated in early 1992 may be postponed if the rolls cannot be duplicated for the National Archives and the eleven Regional Archives. The microfilm copies, storage cabinets for the film, and additional readers and printers must be included in the budget for the next fiscal year if the 1992 opening date is to be met. It has been suggested that genealogists express their concern to the National Archives and elected legislators.

Ohio Microfilms Death Records - According to Jeanne Pramaggiore's "President's Message" in the March 1989 issue of The Ohio Genealogical Society Newsletter, The Ohio Historical Society now has the index to death records from 1908 to 1931 microfilmed and the death records from 1908 to 1922. (It) should not be much longer before all Ohio death records are microfilmed.

The Municipal Archives of the City of New York - With some 80,000 cubic feet of civic documents, vital and building records, libers, films and photographs, New York City's Municipal Archives is a magnet for researchers. A sample of the holdings includes: assessed valuation of real estate, Department of Buildings documents, City Council proceedings, District Attorney's records, WPA Federal Writers' Project photographs, and Local court files.
